Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)

Effective: February 10th, 2026 : Based on 150% of the US Dept. of 2026 Health and Human Services Poverty Guidelines.			
Use total gross income – before taxes and deductions - of ALL household members. Every 60+ year-old household member is eligible to receive their own monthly food package.

To calculate monthly income	
Weekly	Multiply by 4.33
Bi-weekly (every 2 weeks)	Multiply by 2.167
Semi-monthly (2 per month)	Multiply by 2
Lump sums	Divide by 12

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
